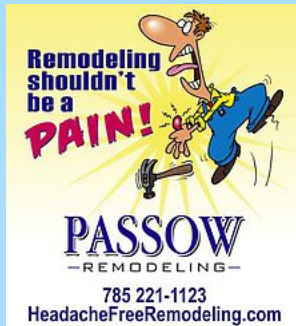

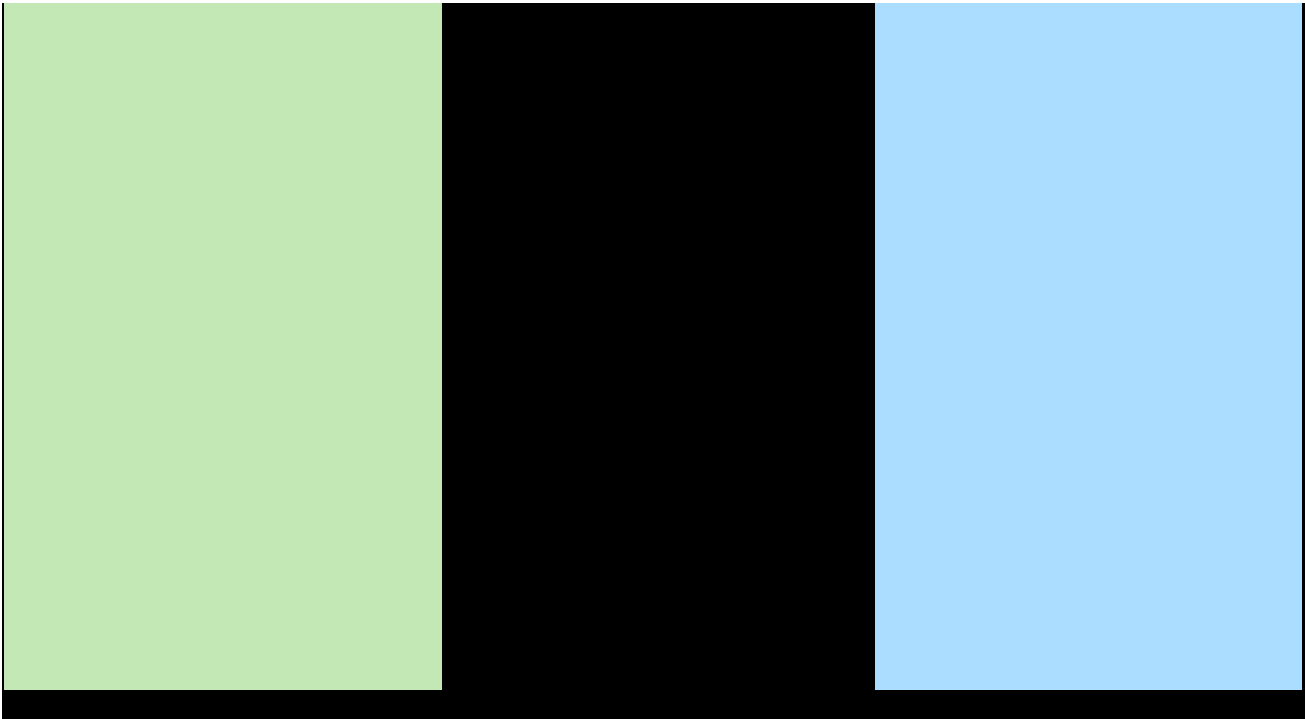

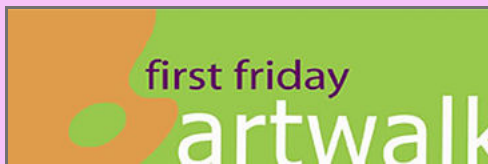

So when you're looking for songs, if they can express that, then you've found something special." Without a doubt Williams, whose hits with the likes of "Good Ole Boys Like Me," "I Believe In You," "Love Is On A Roll," "Amanda" and "Tulsa Time," have always had a knack for finding songs that speak directly to people's hearts.
